# **Disability Blue Badge: How to Apply**

If you struggle to get around, you could get a Blue Badge and park closer to where you are going. It lets you park in onstreet spaces, on single or double yellow lines when loading is permitted, and in some private car parks. You don't have to be the driver.



### Who is automatically eligible for a Disability Blue Badge?

- Are registered or certified severely sight-impaired, or have a letter from your
  Visual Impairment Care Team confirming you are eligible.
- Get higher rate of mobility component of Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- Get higher rate of mobility component of Child Disability Payment (CDP).
- Get Adult Disability Payment (ADP), [ADP is transitioning from Personal independence Payment (PIP) in Scotland], and scored 8 or more points in the moving around area part of the assessment.
- Get ADP [transitioning from PIP], and scored 12 or more points in the planning and following a journey section of the assessment.
- Get ADP [transitioning from PIP], at an enhanced rate for mobility.
- Are in receipt of War Pensioners' Mobility Supplement
- Get a lump sum payment as part of the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (tariffs 1-8), and certified as having a permanent and substantial disability.

# You may also be eligible if you:-

- Have a substantial disability lasting more than 12 months that means you cannot or are virtually unable to walk.
- Regularly drive and cannot use parking meters due to severe disability in both arms.
- Are responsible for a child under 3 who needs to be near a vehicle for medical treatment, or who uses bulky medical equipment that cannot be carried around.
- Have a mental condition that means you lack awareness about the dangers of traffic when making journeys.
